



A Courtesy Visit of CSAJ 2010 Committee to

The Royal Embassy of Cambodia to Japan

On 31 January 2010, with the consent from His Excellency Hor Monirath, the ambassador of Cambodia to Japan, CSAJ new committee members accompanied by CSAJ's board of advisors paid an official visit to the embassy.

In that occasion as well, His Excellency and officers of embassy also conveyed some information related to political stability and the condition of international relation of Cambodia to the delegates.
